These workshops:

- ✓ **Integrate** collaborative arts-based activities
- ✓ **Showcase** youth-made digital stories that center Indigenous voices
- ✓ **Model** environmental-minded + creative leadership
- ✓ **Embed** Indigenous world views and perspectives into the curriculum

Designed for learners between **grades 6 and 12**, these workshops feature youth-created videos, and interactive activities that prompt creative and critical reflection.

Choose from the following engaging themes:

- > **Community Resistance** (featuring video: *LaYudit'in/Never Give Up*)
Recognize ways communities organize to protect cultural and physical environments.
- > **Social Movements** (featuring video: *Thicker than Oil*)
Creatively map current climate struggles and forms of resistance; explore relationship between personal + collective action and social change.
- > **Art as Activism** (featuring video: *Save Our Waters*)
Explore role of art in communicating hopes + concerns, and affecting social and environmental change.
- > **Stories for the Future** (featuring video: *Pictograph*)
Critically reflect upon how history has been told, and creatively share messages for future generations.
