



REMOTE Interactive Content, Web and App Development Intern

This internship opportunity is presented as part of the “Digital Skills for Youth” program coordinated by the Independent Media Arts Alliance and funded by the Department of Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada.

[Access to Media Education \(AMES\)](#), is offering an opportunity for two interns to collaborate on the development of *Crossroads*, a branching scenario game/educational app, and a series of interactive resources associated with it. Briefly, *Crossroads* is an interactive graphic novel designed to prompt critical reflection, build empathy and level up our capacity to practice intersectional equity in school settings and beyond.

As one of two *Interactive Content, Web and Application Development Interns*, your creative input and vision will be valued, and your experience expanded through an online 4-month internship that involves a mixture of digital skills development, and hands-on application of your emerging digital capacities, and creative and technical skills.

This internship will involve working with and learning from a creative team (that includes AMES staff, project-collaborators, and dedicated mentors) to:

Assist with:

- Game testing and debugging
- Quality Control (QC) and UX refinements
- App distribution, LMS integration
- Design, SEO and discoverability on the Game webpage

Co-create:

- A series of interactive learning modules (using H5P and video) and Educator Guides to deepen understanding of key themes and issues addressed in the game
- A Web-based Educator Hub

Recommended skill set:

- Basic knowledge of coding, web and graphic design
- Some experience with responsive and accessible digital content development
- Well-developed written and verbal communication skills
- Familiarity with Adobe Creative Suite an asset

Interns will:

- Be self-motivated, adept at creative problem solving and working both collaboratively and independently
- Have experience working with diverse communities, an interest in integrating art, technology and education, and a commitment to social justice
- Be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the internship
- Be legally entitled to work in Canada (either a citizen, permanent resident or person with refugee status - work permits are not eligible)

**Remuneration: \$30/hour x 30 hours a week for 4 months
